Official Opening at the BISHOP AUCKLAND TOWN HALL, McGuinness Gallery at 10am - Join with us at the Town Hall and then at POD.



Thursday 11 February

LECTURE: A Battalion: 18 Durham Light Infantry, training and in action 10.30am at Bishop Auckland Methodist Church, Bishop Auckland: FREE

Locally raised, 18 DLI was a Pals battalion that first saw action on the Somme. This talk focuses on their journey from a bunch of raw recruits to a disciplined military unit, including newly discovered evidence from an archaeological dig that took place at Cocken Hall in summer 2015.

LECTURE: The Germans on the Somme, through the paintings of Albert Heim 2pm at St. Mary's Church, Bishop Auckland: FREE

The popular image of the Somme is in black and white and emphasises the Allied perspective. This talk looks at the battle from a German point of view and in colour using the paintings of Albert Heim, a trained artist and illustrator who served on the Western Front.




